DEED

THIS DEED, made this 23 day of June, 1984 between Barbour County party of the first part and Robert Spencer, Mountaineer Boys State Governor, party of the second part.

WITNESSETH

THAT FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF THE SUM ONE CENT, the party of the first part does hereby grant and convey to the party of the second part the following described track of land situated in Barbour County in the city of Philippi the following described track of land beginning at a stake twenty (20) feet south of Barbour County line extending south from Barbor Cottage, county seat approximately 100 yards to a stake twenty (20) feet north of Braxton County line, west from Barbour Street to Barbour Creek, which includes the following notable property. The famous Barbour County Water Tower; Flameway Business office of the Supreme Court of Appeals, be conveyed to the Governor of Boys State from The Barbour County Commission by a deed bearing 23rd day of June 1984 in the office of the clerk of the county court of Barbour County, Philippi, West Virginia in deed book number 1 page 1, to which deed is referenced.

The said party of the first part hereby warrants generally the title to the track of land hereby conveyed.
