SCOT DUVALL, FORMER MBS SUPREME COURT JUSTICE SPEAKS TO CITIZENS

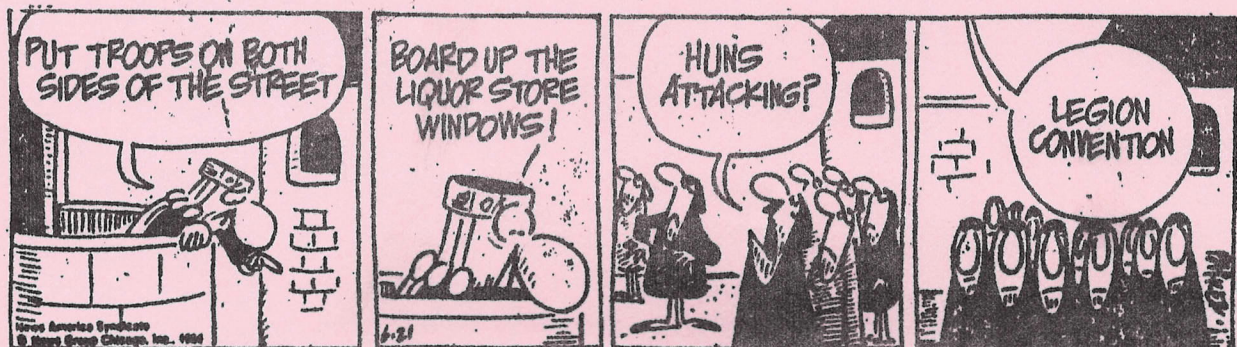
