- 1<sup>st</sup> fold symbolizes life

- 3<sup>rd</sup> fold honors and remembers veterans who have departed from our ranks
- 4<sup>th</sup> fold represents our weaker nature when we turn to God
- 5<sup>th</sup> fold represents tribute to our country
- 6<sup>th</sup> fold represents where our hearts lie in allegiance to the United States
- 7<sup>th</sup> fold signifies tribute to the armed forces
- 8<sup>th</sup> fold signifies tribute to one who entered the valley of shadow of death and to honor mothers
- 9<sup>th</sup> fold represents tribute to womanhood

# Federalist Platform

Plank 3- The adoption of a standard grading scale for all school systems in West Virginia based off the college scale.

Plank 4- Greater flexibility in the administration of standardized tests, such as the Westest. For example a junior student in trigonometry would take a math test on trigonometry, not Algebra 2.

Plank 5- Tax incentives for companies researching new technologies at factories, labs, and other research facilities in the state.

Plank 6- The attracting of new business in the state by the lowering of the state's corporate tax.

Plank 7- The creation of a new revenue source by the adoption of a export tariff on all natural resources in the state, such as coal and natural gas.
