Yay Or Nay? **American** Legion Boys State Officials Pass First Legislation of

This morning, at noon of June 12, 2025, ALMBS delegates passed numerous state-altering bills that changed the trajectory of the society of the 51st State as we know it. With legislation passed such as legalized abortion, bans of mountaintop strip mining,

and banishment of biological men in women's sports, citizens of Boys State will view their home change as they see it.

The vote for the legalization of abortion was fairly onesided, with 43 delegates voting yay, and the remaining 22 voting nay. Nearly no debate or contention was held before the final verdict As for the banishment of assigned-at-birth males competing in women's sports, the verdict was nearly unanimous within the house. 55 of our elected delegates voted yay while only 8 voted nay.

On the contrary, a fiery debate was held on the ban of large scale coal mining, particularly on the summit of mountains. Arguments held on topics such as health of workers, economic instability, and other hard-hitting topics. The verdict from the house concluded with a razor thin 32 yays and 31 nays, an electrifying outcome for the officials.

WV Boys State FD Begins **Training**

Today, June 11, 2025, the WVBS Fire Dept. took on their first portion of real training with equipment and simulated emergencies. The team, suited in fire fighting jackets and respirators, extinguished multiple controlled fires inside of a burning vehicle.

They trained on supporting the attack hose for the front man, which outputs up to 275 PSI. They each took turns extinguishing the flames, all while receiving advice and assistance from their mentors.

To conclude the lesson, the young men listened to a lecture that demonstrated different ways that fire and heat move throughout a burning building.

This presentation included a model house made of plywood which was set aflame, featuring windows and several stories of floors.




